- A valid Wilderness Advanced First Aid 40-hour course or equivalent;
- A full season (summer or winter) of guiding in a leadership role; and
- A valid RCMP security clearance.

AOEG roles & responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Provide expert advice to school staff and K-12 students on outdoor recreation activities;
- Assist school staff with the supervision of students for off-site outdoor activities from day trips to extended overnight trips;
- Provide a safe, positive and supportive environment for students as it relates to off-site outdoor activities by ensuring students are equipped with the appropriate equipment to safely undertake the outdoor activity; and
- Proper use, storage, maintenance and safety of equipment required for the outdoor activity.
