ASSISTANT OUTDOOR EDUCATION GUIDE

We are looking for people to assist with experiential field trips for students in Kindergarten to Grade 12.

AOEG roles & responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Provide expert advice to school staff and K-12 students on outdoor recreation activities;
- Assist school staff with the supervision of students for off-site outdoor activities, from day trips to extended overnight trips;
- Provide a safe, positive and supportive environment for students as it relates to off-site outdoor activities by ensuring students are equipped with the appropriate equipment to safely undertake the outdoor activity; and
- Proper use, storage, maintenance and safety of equipment required for the outdoor activity.

If you possess the following you may qualify to become an AOE:

- A Valid 40hr Wilderness First aid course or equivalent;
- A full season (summer or winter) of guiding in a leadership role;
- A minimum of one qualifying certification
- A valid RCMP security Clearance; and
- AOE's should have knowledge of Yukon First Nations and the First Nations' Territories.
